## When the Law Fails

The purpose of this assignment is to give students an opportunity to examine several case studies of wrongful convictions in Canadian legal history. In particular, students will work in groups to study a particular case of wrongful conviction, note reasons for the failure of the justice system in that case and draw conclusions about such failures, and, finally, make recommendations about how such failings can be corrected in the future.

  - Present a comprehensive overview of the major facts of the case
  - Explain, in your view, the major reasons why justice failed in this case
